

Built in 1895, the Vandalia Chapel is well suited and most frequently used for small old-fashioned wedding ceremonies or intimate funeral services but can also serve as a gathering place for other approved groups.

The Vandalia Schoolhouse, built around 1863, is furnished with antique school desks, benches, tables and chairs, an old pot-belly stove, and still has the original blackboards in place. It offers students (young and old) a trip back into history and is ideal for educational field trips.

In this building there is also a working range (with oven) and a refrigerator. Furnishings can be slightly rearranged, if necessary, to use it alone as a cozy meeting room or in conjunction with the Chapel (i.e., for a small wedding reception or as a preor post-funeral gathering place for friends and family).

Note: While there are convenient primitive outhouses on site, neither of the historic buildings has indoor plumbing or running water.


